Chapter 2: Previous Audits Related to the Environment

Key Message:

Government oversight and accountability is required to ensure timely completion of previous OAG recommendations accepted by Departments

Previous Audits at the Department of Environment

- Completed three audits at Environment over last ten years
- Our last follow-up showed 20 of the 43 recommendations were not completed
- We completed an audit in 2010 of Contaminated Sites
- 11 of 17 recommendations were not complete at our 2014 follow up
- We completed an audit in 2014 of Public Drinking Water Safety
- 8 of 19 recommendations were not complete in February 2017
- We will complete our final follow-up review of the Water audit in early 2018

Previous Audits Impacting or Affected by the Environment

- We completed various audits that have a potential impact on, or could be affected by, the environment
- Aquaculture, Species at Risk, and Critical Infrastructure audits have secondary roles related to Environment
- Each will be followed up, either in 2018 or 2019
- Two other audited programs would be impacted by significant weather events
- These are Disaster Preparedness and Business Continuity Management

5 Questions Nova Scotians may want to ask:

- 1. What happened to the not complete OAG recommendations since the last OAG follow up?
- 2. Why weren't those recommendations completed prior to the OAG's follow up?
- 3. Who is monitoring previous OAG recommendations in Government and what process and public reporting occurs?
- 4. Who is responsible to implement the commitments made by Government in response to the accepted OAG recommendations?
- 5. When will Government fully implement all new recommendations in this and other reports?
